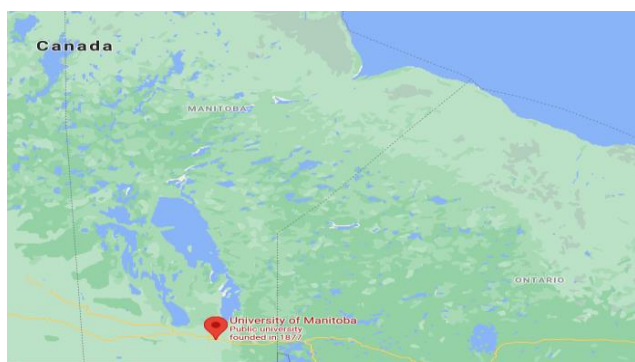

The University of Manitoba is western Canada's first university, established in 1877, and located on original lands of Anishinaabeg, Cree, Oji-Cree, Dakota, and Dene Peoples, and on the homeland of the Métis Nation.



The school is Manitoba's only research-intensive university, and one of the country's top research institutions. They have more than 29,000 undergraduate and graduate students, and more than 145,000 alumni

living in 140 countries.

The university's award-winning faculty and students conduct research in fields as diverse as infectious diseases, Canadian history, materials science, civil infrastructure, population and community health, to name just a few.
