Welcome to Jilin University

Founded in 1946, merged with the former Jilin University of Technology, former Bethune Medical University, former Changchun University of Science and Technology, former Changchun College of Posts and Communications and former University of Military Logistics, Jilin University is one of the key research universities under the direct aegis of the Education Ministry of China, ranking among top 10 in China. JLU is the largest university in China, and offers all the categories of academic disciplines, including Science,



Engineering, Agriculture, Medicine, Economics, Law, Business Administration, Education, History, Literature, Philosophy, Military Science and Arts. Jilin University has the highest enrollment in China with more than 69,000 full-time students in 43 colleges/schools. JLU is currently hosting around 2,000 international students coming from 102 countries.

Jilin University is located in Changchun City, which is a beautiful modern city located to the northeast of Beijing (1.5 hours flight from Beijing), in the heart of the Northeast China Plain. Its urban population is about 4 million. Situated in the temperate zone, Changchun is neither too hot nor too cold with four distinct seasons and an annual average summer



temperature of 22°C. There are many places for sightseeing in the city. For example: Jingyue Tan (Crystal Moon Lake) to the southeast of the city is known for its largest artificial forest area in Asia and a national resort with perfect ecological environment; the Puppet Manchurian Palace was built for Puyi, the last emperor of the Qing Dynasty.

About School of International and Public Affairs (SIPA)

The Era of Public Diplomacy calls for new type of talents who are good at communication and dialogue, have good knowledge of world economy, politics and cultural plurality. As an answer to this calling and to promote public diplomacy and cultural exchanges, Jilin University has set up the School of International and Public Affairs (SIPA) which is the first school oriented in public diplomacy studies among Chinese universities. In 2014 SIPA participated as a founding member in the establishment of "Collaborative Innovation Center of the Theory and Practices of China's Diplomacy" initiated by China Foreign Affairs University.

The School of International and Public Affairs has being undertaken the English conducted graduate program of "Contemporary International Relations Studies" since 2006, and has constructed a faculty team specialized in International Studies, Law, Economics, Journalism, History and Cross-Cultural Communication, etc. Prof. Debin Liu, Dean of SIPA is the Vice-President of China National Association for International Studies. Besides, SIPA also includes Barry Buzan who is member of British Academy of Science and a former professor of London School of Economics, Brantly Womack who is the Friendship Award recipient and professor of government and diplomacy in the University of Virginia, and other well-known professors as Honorary or Guest Professors.

SIPA combines the training of Chinese students and International students together and adopted English as the working language for main courses. The purpose is to lay out a multiethnic-multicultural platform, promote research in public diplomacy, China studies and international relations, and cultivate a new generation of herald of civility and specialist in communication.

SIPA regularly organizes an international workshop on IR theory and current international issues every year and the annual graduate workshop on East Asia from which some '2+2' and '3+1' joint education programs has been launched with multiple overseas universities. It provides students with at least one year overseas study experience which will broaden their visions and future.

SIPA will steadily uphold the educational ideal of internationalization, inclusiveness, innovation and practice, and will put greater endeavor for the development of public diplomacy disciplines in China.



Course Objective

This course will make a historical review of the changes towards rule of law in China stimulated both by exterior factors such as foreign aggression since the 1840s and the interior factors such as the intention to build China a strong and wealthy state. The achievements and problems will be reviewed based on the cases in recent years, and a prospect for the future will be casted.

Course Objective

Set against the background of profound changes in China over the past decades, this lecture titled as "China and the World" aims to examine the nature of China's peaceful rise and the reasons behind the historical mission. To that end, it is necessary to use as a key reference the statement of Chinese government that the development of China relies on the world community and, in turn, the whole world would be benefitted from the stability and development of China which aspires to preserve the current world order by pursuing a proactive and a responsible foreign policy.

Course Objective

The course offers a general picture of the foreign policies changes since the onset of China, with focus especially laying on the thirty years social progress and change. The course explores the imbedded traditional elements in foreign policies changes and social restructuring in the last thirty years while trying not to elude students toward historical nihilism. Meanwhile, propose questions to students about the future of China's social change and its worldly significance.

Part III: Chinese culture, it's the core of the course. This part will be divided into a few sections according to topic: traditional ideology, festival, food and art which consist of literature, painting, sculpture, building, calligraphy, folk handicraft, music, opera, etc.

Course Objective

The course of Chinese Government and Politics is the systematic integration and introduction on both of the theory and practice of Chinese Government and Politics. It will help the audiences lead a better and clearer understanding of the basic national conditions, social power and institution architecture of China though the detailed description of the development and practical exploration as well as the current situation about Chinese government and politics. The audiences could also treat and understand various phenomena of Chinese society by learning this course. The main content of this course are as followed: The contemporary Chinese Constitution and the political system; the political party system of China; the Chinese political consultation system; the Chinese National People's congress system, etc.

8. China, Japan and South Korea Relations: Current State and Prospect Course Instructor

Ren Mu is Lecturer of School of International and Public Affairs at Jilin University. She is a graduate of Jilin University and received her Ph.D. from Ritsumeikan University in Japan. She has published several articles on China's foreign policy. Now, she is working on Japan's public diplomacy, international relations in East Asia, and the theory of international relations. Course Objective

There are various issues surrounding the relations between and among the three countries, such as historical legacies, territorial disputes, and economic conflicts. Particularly, some bilateral relations of the three countries are not stable in dealing with these issues. Some even have seen the relations of the three pessimistically. Why do the three countries have these thorny problems? How do they perceive these issues and their relations? What, then, can we see the prospect of their relations, and will be reasonable to expect the relations?

9. Traditional Chinese Calligraphy

This course provides introduction of Chinese ancient writing, history and schools of different style of writing. Meanwhile, students will also be taught how to write with a Chinese writing brush.





10. Tai Chi Chuan

This course provides basic Tai Chi knowledge and real practices of several sets of Tai Chi Chuan.





11. Chinese Traditional Painting

This course provides introduction of Chinese ancient painting, students will also be taught how to paint with a Chinese painting brush.





12. Chinese Paper-cuts

This course provides introduction of Chinese Paper-cuts, and local artist of paper-cuts will come to class to teach students how to do some simple cuts.
