Science, SKKU

The Department of Library & Information Science at SKKU was established as a Department of Library in March 1964. Later, the master's course was opened in 1971. And in March 1974, the Ph.D. program was offered for the first time in Korea. In March 1991, the department changed its name to "Library and Information Science" in response to internal and external changes to the information society. As of 2014, there were about 1,800 graduates in 50 years. These alumni play the leading roles in various fields; library, media and publishing industries, general business, public institutions, and IT. As the information technology and globalization have rapidly advanced, the emerging technology is "Know-where" instead of "Know-how". "Know-Where" is a new technique which enables you to accurately locate the information and use it when needed. It is an efficient information-utilizing method for collecting, analyzing, researching, and sharing information. At this point, the Dept. of Library & Information Science takes heavier responsibility and role. This is because it is urgent to train information experts who can efficiently utilize the exploding information in the era of hyper-speed information and communication. If information is the power in the future, Library & Information Science handling information will be the study of power. And thus, the information professions from it will be the occupation of power.

The Dept. of Library & Information Science at SKKU aims to provide more specialized undergraduate programs in the field of Information Science in reflect of the trends of the current era called "Digital Era" and "Big Data Era". At the same time, it maintains social effectiveness by continuously operating the traditional subject areas such as library and bibliography. As part of this, the Dept. of Library & Information Science became the first Korean member of the International iSchool Consortium in February 2014, which has very difficult conditions, such as education and research capability. Most of all, the Dept. of Library & Information Science was selected for the metropolitan-specialization project and launched a data science specialized curriculum in the spring 2015 to foster the data scientists in the big data era.
