

## **Final Presentation**

Give a group presentation about a paper that you found interesting.

1. Introduce the study. What's the topic? Why is it important? Give appropriate background details. Use appropriate visuals.
2. Explain the methodology. What did the researchers do? What processes did they follow? Explain it clearly so the audience can understand. Use appropriate visuals to help.
3. Summarize the results. Tell us what the researchers found, and explain the relevance and importance of the results. Use visual aids. Introduce them and explain them appropriately.
4. Give a conclusion. Include the five components. If one is missing from the paper, add it yourself if possible.
5. There will be a Q&A at the end of the presentation. Be ready to answer questions from the audience.

### **Directions:**

- Three people per team.
- Up to 10 minutes per team.
- Discuss the main components of each section.
- Talk about the paper, but don't read it to us.
- Use quotes where appropriate.
- Use visual aids for each section. Help the audience visualize the experiment and the context.
